## Trident Maritime Trauma Course (TMTC)

The TMTC is a 3-day University-accredited physical trauma management course, designed specifically for the maritime security industry. The course covers non-invasive trauma management procedures and prolonged care and is delivered by State registered paramedics. The course culminates in a practical moulage assessment aboard a commercial vessel.

### Why attend this course?

International standards such as the International Code of Conduct for Private Security Service Providers, International Maritime Organisation interim guidance and flag State directives recommend that Maritime Security Operatives are appropriately medically trained. Training should be specific to task and relevant to the operational environment.

### Benefits

The TMTC is focussed heavily on practical 'hands-on' trauma management and prolonged care in the maritime environment. No other course offers this level of operationally focussed training.
